




Rose's Ramblings



It's hard to believe that it is nearly three years since I started working for the ACE Youth Worker Trust and the original funding is coming to an end. Looking back it has been a winding journey with an assortment of successes. It is interesting to see where God has guided us – as none of us dreamed the project would be where it is now – with the main emphasis on supporting young people within the school, and providing activities and advocacy for young people in the community. ACE is seen as a unique project within the secular community and of vital importance, filling a gap that currently no other youth agencies fill. We have the support of QEGS senior management, the County Council Youth Service (from whom we have been given the equivalent of around £10,000 for different projects), Connexions (formerly Careers service), Police, who support our work and use us as partners in community initiatives; and the new hospital has asked us to lead a youth consultancy for young people's health issues within and outside the hospital.

In less than three short but busy years, the project has made a deep impact on the local community – and we are so grateful to you for your support – financial, prayer and emotional! I am also deeply thrilled and touched that many of you have opted to continue the support of this unique project into the future. Thank you from the bottom of my heart and on behalf of the young people of the area who have been expressing panic to me if the project ended now.

Young people appreciate the project, especially the help given at the lowest time in their lives and support the search for future funding. It is my passion to lift and support young people at their lowest ebb. This is not being a social worker as has been complained about; any person working in God's grace should be holding a helping hand out to those in need. This is the prime example Jesus gave. If you boiled down the Gospels it would be Jesus loving and loving and loving – the rich, the poor, the scape-goated, the despised; "to bind up the broken-hearted" –

and I am so delighted to try to be God's hands to young people in the Ashbourne area; and pray hard that this will continue. I've included below a few quotations of young people and other services, so that you can rightly share in the thanks that others express for the ACE Trust.

“Linda is an incredibly positive and pro-active member of staff who is non judgmental. She is motivated and committed. She understands. She does not question; she does not aim to change. She gives of her time freely and is always there to support. Staff at Queen Elizabeth's Grammar School and staff from involved external agencies consider we as a community have benefited from Linda's involvement.” *Ann Hambly SENCO, QEGS*

“Linda is the best thing since sliced bread. Cos she's always there when you need her and always there to help if you, like ever need a hand. She's a perfect youth worker for the area. When she first came she did a lot of work with bonding the police and young people together, now there's a relationship between everybody.” *Lad age 18*

“Linda has helped me because I don't get in trouble anymore. I think this has helped me because she doesn't work for the school” *14 year old lad with court order*. I believe in the short time I have known Linda she has made me more motivated and helped me to get my target grades.” *Same lad 18 months later*.

“support sessions help me, calm me down, if I didn't have Linda I would be a lot different.” *16 year old girl rarely in school*.

“Linda helps me explore my feelings – so it makes them come out instead of keeping it in. Other people don't get what people have been through – Linda's got experience of what people have been through so she can help people.” *14 year old bereaved girl*.

“Linda is very helpful and kind and always there for you and people. She helps out very well. It made a difference about looking at me and what my life is kind of about, how to change things that are bad in my life. It keeps me out of trouble. It helped me settle in school.” *14 year old with multiple difficulties*

“If it hadn't been for you I'd have topped myself”; *18 year old girl with multiple difficulties*

These successes involve me at the face to face end, but the project is way bigger than just myself. The tireless hard work of Trustees and friends of the Trust, as fundraisers, managers, and other crucial practical roles plus the ongoing financial and prayer support from dedicated people across the area is the bedrock of this work. Without you, the work could not be done. Please continue to support in whatever way you can. We ARE making a difference in young people's lives – from literally saving lives, to improving education and expectations, to keeping young people out of criminal trouble. Young people – like us all – are formed in the image of God; we just help them discover the love and joy in the best of God's kingdom. Thank you on their behalf for all that you do, and hopefully continue to do.

Dear Resident

It was reported on the 23/4 three miles out of Ashbourne that a bullock was on the highway. Later in the month another report of a cow on the road near to the Bluebell Inn at Tissington. This is quite a common occurrence on the A515 and often happens in a rural area, but a solution must be found before there is an incident.

I am at the present time liaising with DDDC Highways Department to resolve the issue of cattle grids and their condition, this is a contributory factor to the issue. Although most are in good repair, many are not and over the years have been covered by 'plates', this obviously allows animals to 'escape' out of the fields. May I thank the farmers and the

community for all their cooperation during my attempt to resolve this issue. More information to follow next month.

The Safer Neighbourhood Policing Team are also liaising with agencies regarding traffic/parking issues in several villages. More information will follow with a happy solution for all concerned.

At Thorpe on 10/5 there was an unexpected discovery by two people on the rifle range. A 2in. mortar was found buried in the bank!

Local Officers were immediately deployed to the location and the Bomb Disposal Unit were deployed from Nottingham. A cordon was set up and an assessment of the scene was conducted.

The Bomb Disposal Unit arrived and it was confirmed that this was a 'live' bomb, probably from the WWII. They then dug a hole and detonated the bomb! Safety of the public being paramount. The cooperation and organisation of all the emergency services is just so important when an emergency occurs.

During the 'Bearded Theory' event several items were stolen from a tent, these including cash, and car keys.

Tissington Well Dressings have been incident free, and a good time, from the response of the visitors speaking to me when on foot patrol at the event, has been had by all. The tearooms have been extremely busy and the staff all seem to keep smiling throughout! The weather was so sunny and warm just perfect for visitors to the village and surrounding areas.

We continue to live in an area that is low on crime and anti-social behaviour. In relation to this it continues to be one of the best areas in the country to live.



640 MINUTES The minutes of the previous Annual Parish meeting, held on 18th May, 2009 were unanimously approved & signed by the chair.

641 CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

1. Cllr R. Neilson opened his report by stating the Cllrs had remained the same throughout the year, which was a positive result, unlike the recent past. He wished to thank them for giving up their time & effort to undertake this responsibility.

2. Eileen Glanville has once again conducted her responsibilities as Clerk throughout the year, & wished to thank her for the excellent job she has done.

3. Many parishioners have taken the time to visit & participate in the public speaking section, which have made the meetings far more valuable.

4. Thank you's – P.C. Kate Clevely & previously P.C. Ian Cooper for attending many of the meetings, and assisting in following through items & giving beneficial advice, and Cllr S. Spencer who attended meetings when convenient.

6. Following the Annual meeting held on 18th May, 2009 there have been 7 Parish Council meetings.

7. Three planning applications have been submitted, 2 of which are still pending.

8. The precept for 2010/11 was set at £3300, which is slightly lower than £3320 for year 2009/10. The balance carried forward however is slightly higher at £1953-04. Costs were held relatively tight again for another year, with village maintenance being the largest expense.

A payment of £440 was donated to the Village Hall Committee towards the repair of the roof, which supported a grant for the balance.

Village maintenance was once again done by Mr C. Challinor, who has again tendered & won the contract for 2010/11 season.

The kind donation from Cllr R. Caswell of £200 was invested in painting the railings around the "Wellingtonia" tree.

The village project under consideration this year is the repairing of the "Well Pump Room", which is being investigated with the help of the PDNPA to see

what grants can be obtained, how much the Parish Council will need to invest & over what time period.

9. The Parish Council have dealt with items in connection to footpaths, highways, & stated their support for Mr Smith in his requirement for the trees to be thinned out on the Peveril Hill alongside his boundary wall.
10. Finally changes were made to the "Standing Orders" with regard to Election of Chairman & Vice Chairman.

651 VILLAGE PROJECT

A meeting was held on Friday 14th May, with Mr Martin Burfott PDNPA, Cllrs A. Wager, R. Neilson, A. Wainwright & C. Lomas (part of the meeting).

The purpose of the meeting was to establish if grants would be available and if the project was viable.

Mr Burfott believed the project is urgent and partial grant funding available.

This could be staged over 2-3 years

The initial step would be to get a detailed quotation, then 1-2 other quotes. Mr Burfott was willing to attend & assist in this process. Following the quotations, consideration could be given to which fund could assist with each section of the process.

652 REQUEST FOR FINANCIAL SUPPORT

The Village Hall Management Committee have taken on the project of getting a hearing loop installed, & requested if the Parish Council would consider £283 towards the cost. This would help with funding availability.

After a short discussion it was unanimously agreed to offer the £283 when required.

Following the “Standing Orders” training course the Clerk has recently attended, she explained the need for amendments to be considered & adopted before Parish Council Elections in 2011. Agreed for new standing order booklet be circulated to Cllrs for comments.

The Clerk presented a new agenda recommended by DALC, but stressed that the agenda be used to each council’s individual preference. Agreed to circulate for comments.

The public toilets situated adjacent to the public car park are under review, and D.D.D.C. would like to work with the Parish Council to consider all options that may be available to keep them open.

3. Land Registry – It was discussed as to which land in the village, e.g. Village Green, Lower Green etc. is registered as Common Land or Parish Ground
