Cllr A. Wainwright declared a personal interest on item 6(iii) planning, due to a close association with the applicant.

671 PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

1. Review of Public Conveniences.

Cllr S. Spencer firstly wished to clarify the situation. The proposals are only a consultation process at this point in time.

Derbyshire Dales does appreciate that tourism is the livelihood of the area, & that the toilets in Thorpe are well used, but consideration of the many options available must be considered. Mr John Bailey expressed his strong views against closure of the toilets. He felt the Parish Council are not capable of taking on the care & finance these toilets need, & as these are mainly used by tourists/visitors it should be the responsibility of the District Council.

2. Cllr S. Spencer spoke of the current issues surrounding the repairs to the "Stepping Stones".

They were previously repaired in 1969, & although they may appear "out of place" at present, they will in time with wear & tear look more natural. The issue of "Health & Safety" is not correct, as these are classed as a public footpath.

3. Mr Potter gave his detailed reasons for objecting to Mr Frith's planning application (item 6(iii)), & asked the Parish Council to take his points into consideration when making a decision.

A letter from Mr Archer was circulated to the Cllrs which gave his reasons for also objecting to the above application, & asked the Parish Council for their support.


