Staff Appointment

On Monday 20th June our school's governing body held interviews for the infant teacher vacancy. The six candidates completed a range of tasks including a gruelling interview with the School Council, delivering a 20 minute interaction task to a selection of EYFS/KS1 children before finally completing the process with a formal interview which provided an opportunity for the candidates to discuss and explain their knowledge and understanding of teaching in a mixed age class and being part of a small school team.

The standard of the applicants was exceptionally high and after much deliberation the governors' vote was unanimous - Miss Hannah Pendrigh was appointed and joins our team in September. I'm delighted to say that she will be joining us for the day on **Thursday 23rd June** to introduce herself to the community and begin to get to know our school, in particular the infant class which of course she will assume responsibility for in September.
