And so to Easter...

Several years ago I had the privilege of visiting Israel. So many of the sacred sites are now tourist attractions and although it was interesting to visit them, they left no lasting impression. Many of the sites are of course, disputed, the academics unable to determine exactly where these now famous events took place.

One place however has stayed with me. The Church of St Peter in Gallicantu is thought to be built on the site of the High Priest's house (from the time of Christ), this, the academics do seem fairly certain of. Christ was taken to the High Priest's house after his arrest and held in the cells overnight. It was here that the Apostle Peter denied being one of Christ's disciples.

To the side of the church building are the original stone steps that Christ must have been led up. Underneath the church are the cells, one of which Christ must have been incarcerated in.

By the time we reached the church, our tour group had been travelling for several days, a fast-paced, fairly academic tour led by a local University archaeologist. We'd seen so many places and I'd heard so many talks that my head was spinning. We stood in a room below the church looking at a hole in the floor, perhaps two or three feet wide, cut through solid rock. Through the hole, perhaps twenty feet below, lay the floor of one of the original cells, used to hold the prisoners. Our tour leader explained that prisoners would have been bound hand and foot, attached to a long rope and then dropped through the hole. There would have been nothing on the stone floor below to break their fall. With their hands and feet bound together, they would have been unable to help themselves; the prisoner would have hit the stone floor hard - Christ would have hit the stone floor with bone shattering force.

Of all the sites we visited, of all the talks I heard, this stayed in my mind because this brought home the awfulness, the brutality of that first Easter week. Of course, for Christ, this was just the beginning of his suffering.

As Christians, we approach Holy Week with mixed emotions. Maundy Thursday and Good Friday give us moments for sober reflection as we consider again the evil that Christ confronted and suffered. Then we come to Easter Sunday celebrating Christ, through his resurrection, overcoming the evil of this world. This evil is the evil that we suffer too and also the wrong that we know we are sometimes responsible for. As we celebrate on Easter Sunday, we celebrate love and forgiveness - God's love for us and his forgiveness extended to us, love and forgiveness that we are now tasked to share with all.

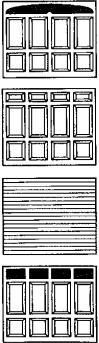

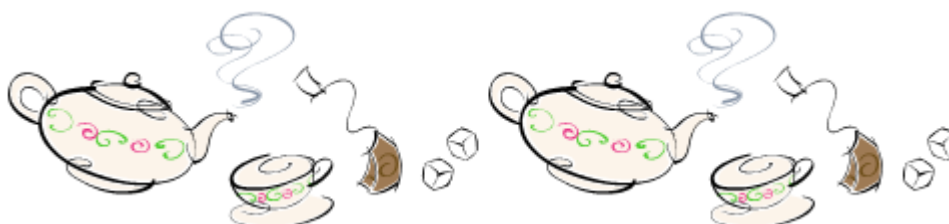

From the director of Calendar Girls comes the new comedy-drama with an all star British cast. 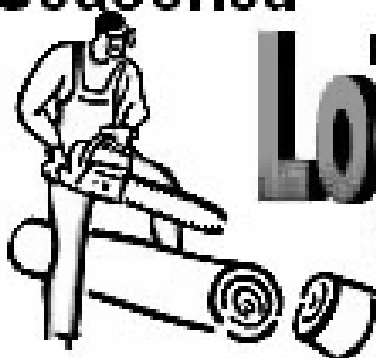
