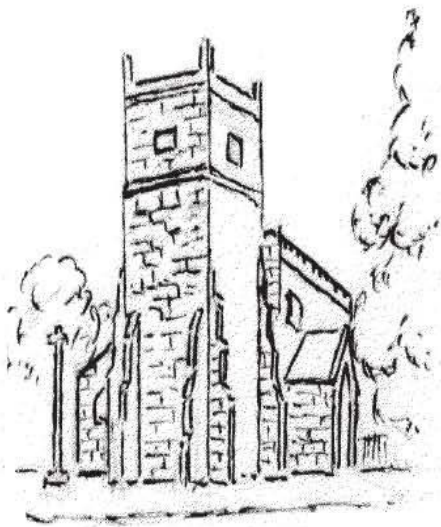
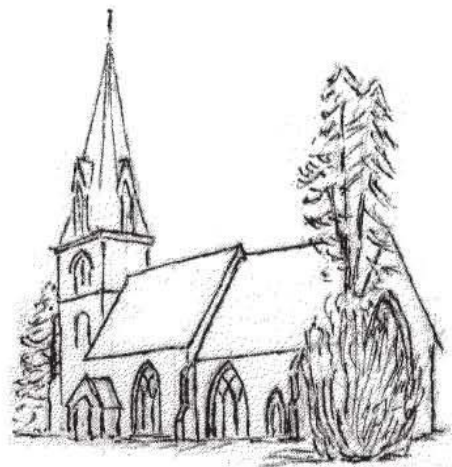

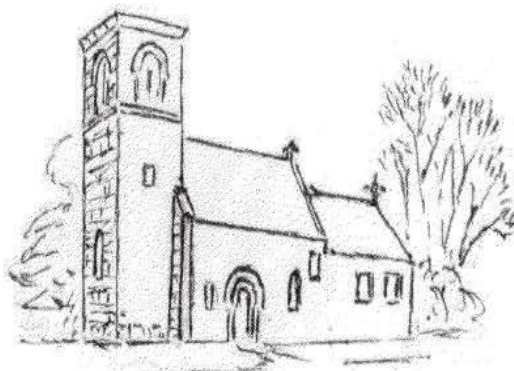

From your Vicar...

Dear friends

This magazine will hopefully have arrived in your hands just before Remembrance Day. As Christians, the subject of war and remembrance might sometimes feel at odds with what we believe. After all, Christ said "Blessed are the peacemakers" and "Love your neighbour as you love yourself". Can peace and love come from the barrel of a gun or the blast of a bomb? This is a hard and complex question.

Pacifism is brave and noble, especially when it actually encounters violence. Whilst some are able to frame their lives with this viewpoint, for others there are situations that require a reaction - situations where inaction could be considered to be giving in to bullying or to letting injustice flourish.

There are wars where we act to protect ourselves, to defend against the aggression of others and then there are wars where we are not endangered but we act to defend a friend or a group of people being unjustly persecuted. Though it is always possible for our leaders to make mistakes, thankfully we don't live in a country that engages in hatred-fuelled, unprovoked acts of aggression.

History shows that love and peace can come after war, if those involved can see past the flawed ideologies that led to the conflict and instead focus on their common humanity. Indeed our present good relationship and economic partnership with Germany is ample testament to this. I'm sure we all hope and pray that our involvement in Libya will equally lead to peace, democracy and stability for all the people of that land.

With every conflict our nation enters into there will be those who can see the rationale and those who can't. Once our democratic nation decides to use force alongside diplomacy, there are those amongst us who are told to risk their lives. The financial cost of war is considerable but it is dwarfed by the human cost. A price that has been paid by so many over the years, in order to secure our

freedom. Whether we agree or disagree with war, whether we agree or disagree with any particular conflict, November 11th provides us with a time to pause and reflect, a time to remember the lives given in love for this nation.

I'm sure you join me in praying for our armed forces, for their families and for those who have lost loved ones in recent conflicts.

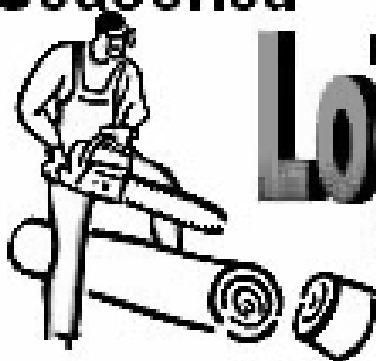

### **Spiced Pumpkin Soup** – serves 4

*A good starter for an autumn supper or with crusty bread for lunch*

3 tbsp Olive Oil  
2 Med Red Onions chopped  
2 Sticks Celery  
2 Cloves Garlic  
2 cm piece of fresh Ginger peeled & finely chopped  
1 kg Pumpkin, peeled, seeded & chopped into 2 cm cubes  
2 tsp ground Cumin  
Pinch Cayenne  
750 ml chicken or veg stock  
Salt & Pepper  
100ml Double Cream



Heat the oil in a pan large enough for all the ingredients, add onions, celery, garlic & ginger and cook gently for about 5 mins until soft. Add pumpkin, cumin & cayenne and gently cook for 7-8 mins until pumpkin starts to soften and brown around the edges.

Add the stock, cover pan and cook for 20 mins until pumpkin is soft. Remove soup from heat and blend until smooth. Season to taste and add the cream. If you prefer a thinner soup, milk can be added at this stage. Ladle the steaming soup into bowls and enjoy!

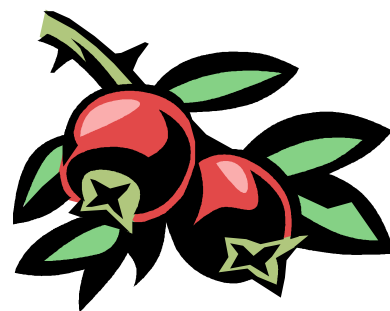

**Spiced Cranberry Chutney –**

*Great with cold meats*



(Makes 2 x 1lb (350 ml) Jars)

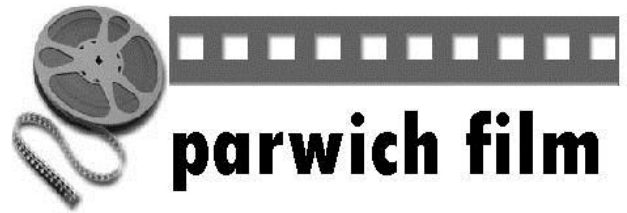
2 Cinnamon Sticks  
1 tsp ground Cloves  
1lb (450g) Cranberries  
2 tbsp freshly ground Root Ginger  
1 Med Red Onion chopped  
12 oz (350g) Demerara Sugar  
Grated Zest & Juice of 2 Oranges  
15 fl oz (425 ml) Red Wine Vinegar  
1 tsp Salt

Place all ingredients in a wide, shallow pan. Bring to simmering point & stir well, keeping the heat at a gentle simmer, let the chutney bubble & reduce for about 45 mins or until you can draw a wooden spoon across the surface and leave a trail that doesn't fill up with vinegar. It will thicken also as it cools.

Fill the sterilised jars with chutney (discard the cinnamon sticks), cover with waxed discs, seal with the lids and label when cold.

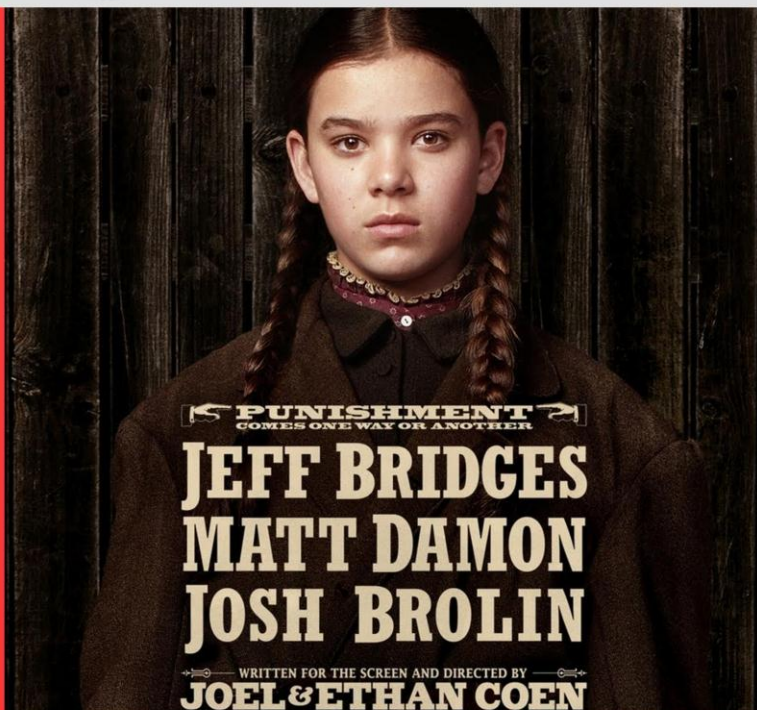

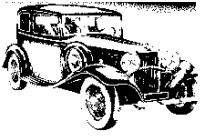

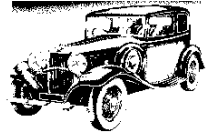

She herself has been blind for most of her life and she brought her latest guide dog, Elsa, who lay under the table at her feet quite content. She gave a very clear account of her experiences from an early age with all her guide dogs over the years, as well as giving a glimpse into the history of the charity, which celebrates its 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in 2012. Through sheer determination and courage she overcame various obstacles to eventually become a teacher - a most uplifting and at times amusing life story. She was brought by Rob Jackson who himself is a puppy walker and trainer for *Guide Dogs*. In April he came with his wife, Angi, and the dog they were training at that time, Wells, to give a talk.

A total of **£91.00** was donated at the coffee morning which included two donations from people who had not been at the event. A cheque for this amount was sent to Angi Jackson who is treasurer of their local branch of *Guide Dogs*. She sent an email to 'give heartfelt thanks to everyone for the wonderful donation.' She said that Rob had thoroughly enjoyed being with us again and they hope to visit us briefly at a future Coffee Morning to bring the guide dog, Wells, to let us see how he is getting on. Unfortunately, they are unable to come in November.

Judy Taylor has also sent an email to thank everyone for the generous donation. It was a real pleasure to meet us all and she hopes to come back again sometime in the future – hopefully next year.

A letter has been received from the *Christian Blind Mission* to thank us for our donation of £40.30 towards their vital work in developing countries. It was greatly appreciated.

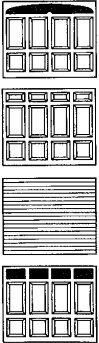
