From your vicar...

Have you started your Christmas shopping yet?

At the beginning of November I was chatting with the staff in a café. A huge parcel had arrived from Head Office containing all the Christmas decorations for the shop. They had only just taken down the Halloween decorations and they were now moving straight on, to Christmas. "Don't you know that Christmas starts on November 4th Andy?", I was asked. "It doesn't in the Church of England" I replied. Clearly Head Office had decided that the carefully crafted Christian year was running a little too slowly for their liking!

In the traditional churches, our year moves through different Christian seasons. The most well known ones being Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter perhaps, but there are more. The seasons are there for a reason. Each season brings different aspects of the Christian faith into focus, helping us to maintain a balance and harmony in our faith. Many of you will have noticed that we change the colour of the fabric used to decorate the churches (on the altars and lecterns), several times throughout the year. Each change corresponds to a change of season in the Christian year.

As Christmas becomes more and more the property of retail businesses, we start to be bombarded with Christmas messages (and opportunities to purchase!) earlier and earlier. Does this matter? What do we lose?

If we start Christmas on November 4th then we miss out the entire of the season of Advent, which this year starts on Sunday November 27th, giving us four clear Sundays before Christmas day. What is Advent? It is a time when we wait, when we anticipate. It's a time when we remember that the Jewish nation and indeed the whole world waited for Christ to be born into this world. It's a time when we look forward to the fact that Christ will come again ushering in the end of this world as we know it. Advent is a time of hopefulness, reminding us that our faith takes us beyond the 'here and now', setting our hearts and minds on the hope of Heaven. A time and place that will be without suffering, pain or hardship. A time and a place where humanity will be at peace.

Let's not rush Advent but take the time to think, to pray, to remind ourselves of the hope our faith gives us.

Wishing you Christ's peace and in the fullness of time, a very happy Christmas.

Winter will be with us anytime and the annual problem with salt theft from the bins. The parish council had to purchase additional salt over the last 2 years, (around £300.00) due to theft of salt from the bins which are for public highway use only. We are considering mixing a dye into the salt that shows up when snow melts so that people who have taken it can be identified, as this is stealing. This dye is the same as used for drain tracing and pond colouring so is harmless to wildlife, anyone seen taking salt for private use from the bins will be reported. Salt for private use can be bought from local agricultural and builders merchants.

Anyone volunteering to clear snow from the public and the elderly people's paths in the village can use the salt (without dye) that the parish council have available. Please contact me on 07836 770945 or 01335 350187.

We are also very concerned about the increase in reports of dog fouling on Ashes Lane and the police are monitoring this.

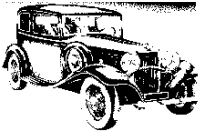

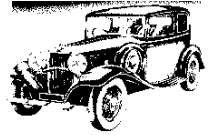

Quick Spicy Chicken

(Serves 6)

(Please note – cooked turkey can be substituted in this recipe – it is a good way of using up leftover Christmas turkey)



4oz Onion finely chopped
1 Tblspn Oil
1 Level Tblspn madras curry powder
 $\frac{1}{4}$ pt stock
2 level teaspn tomato purée
Juice of $\frac{1}{2}$ lemon
4 level tblspn apricot jam
3 tblspn fresh whipped cream
 $\frac{1}{4}$ pt real mayonnaise
 $\frac{1}{4}$ pt salad cream
1 lb cooked chicken chopped (or turkey)

- Heat the oil and gently fry the finely chopped onion until soft.
- Add the curry powder and cook for one minute.
- Stir in the stock, tomato purée, lemon juice and apricot jam. Bring to the boil and simmer for 10 minutes, then allow to cool.
- Stir in the mayonnaise, salad cream and cream, then add the chicken (or turkey) meat to the sauce.
- Season to taste and add plenty of freshly ground black pepper.
- Serve with rice salad.

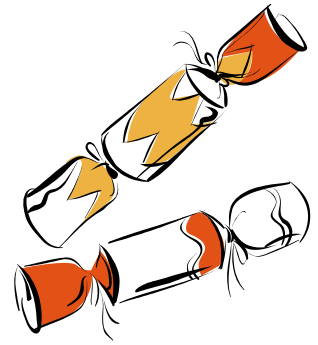

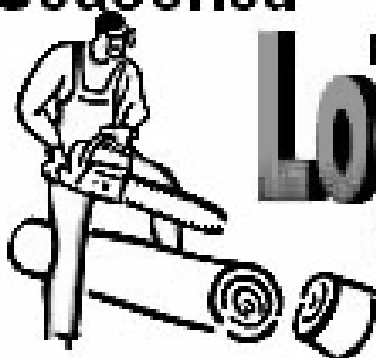

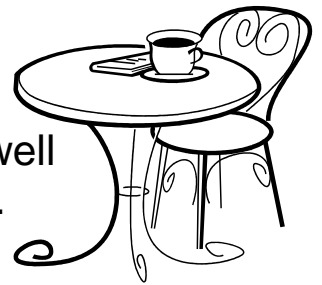

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THORPE PARISH COUNCIL, HELD ON TUESDAY 8TH NOVEMBER, 2011 AT 8PM IN THORPE VILLAGE HALL.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION.

The Chair welcomed Cllr A. McCloy, who is the Parish Representative to the PDNPA.

1. Cllr A. McCloy opened his report by giving brief details of his role as a serving Parish Councillor, & Parish Representative to Peak Park. He stated he would welcome any queries/problems that may arise in the future, & would endeavour to attend as many meetings as possible. The most recent “talking point” is the threatened closure of the public toilets at “Dovedale”. He is hoping that as a result of recent meetings, Peak Park are inviting interested parties to get together to see what can be jointly achieved as a solution to the current problem.

2. Cllr F. Smith relayed concerns raised by Mr J. Bailey. He wished for the Parish Council to consider his following comments.

He felt last year’s Precept was set far too high & needed to be lowered for the coming year. Also, the toilets in Thorpe Car Park should be retained, but, not at the expense of the Parish Council.
