BBC Radio Derby's Andy Whittaker recently asked for a traditional recipe for Derbyshire Oatcakes.

Enjoy!

In some ways, oatcakes are similar to pancakes and can be served with savoury fillings and accompaniments or sweet ones.

This recipe makes four Derbyshire oatcakes or 12 Staffordshire oatcakes.

The recipe is the same you just use more mixture to make Derbyshire ones - also you can reduce the water/milk mixture to a pint for the Derbyshire variety which makes them thicker too.

Ingredients

8 oz fine oatmeal,
8 oz whole-wheat or plain flour,
1 tsp salt,
1/2 oz fresh yeast,
1 1/2 pints warm milk and water, mixed half and half
1 tsp sugar

Method

1. Add salt to flour and oatmeal.
2. Dissolve yeast with a little warm liquid and add sugar. Allow to become frothy.
3. Mix dry ingredients with yeast and rest of warm liquid to make a batter.
4. Cover with clean cloth and leave in warm place for 1 hour.
5. Bake on well-greased griddle. Put enough batter onto griddle to produce an oatcake to a diameter of your choice.
Derbyshire Oatcakes can be around 6 or 7 inches, Staffordshire Oatcakes are more like 9 inches in diameter.
6. Turn oatcake after 2-3 minutes when upperside appears dry and underside is golden brown, and cook for another 2-3 minutes.

Eat as soon as possible.

Oatcakes freeze well.

Fillings

Try rolling the oatcakes around, or serving them with bacon, mushrooms, cheese, egg, sausage, cheese & beans, cheese & onion or any combination of the above. Or you might like to try filling them with diced fresh fruit with a little cream for a tasty dessert. Maple syrup, jam or honey also go well with oatcakes for breakfast.

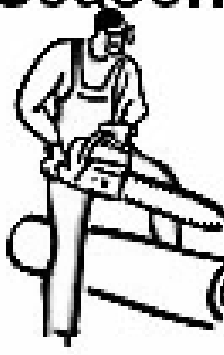

The minutes of the meeting held on 10th January were unanimously approved & signed by the Chair.

751 ON-GOING MATTERS

Village Maintenance/Repairs.

* Cllr W. Smith has contacted Mr Robin Walsh, D.D.D.C. who has verified that "Power Sweeps" are scheduled for April, July, October & January.

* The drain work in "Narlows Lane" has been completed.

* Cllr W. Smith is no longer able to mow the Lower Green, but Mr Duncan Ede has agreed to take on the job.

* Cllr M. Ellis feels the fence surrounding the "Wellingtonia" tree is in disrepair, & should be removed. Cllrs agreed. Cllr M. Ellis to arrange.

* The damaged/missing road signs have not been attended to. PCSO Kate Cleveley offered to report them on our behalf.

* The work on the bridges at Lower Green is still pending. Cllr A.Wager to re-contact.

752 RIFLE RANGE – THORPE PASTURES

The Parish Council are concerned on what safety procedures & insurance are in force at the Rifle Range. PCSO Kate Cleveley stated that the Police regularly check all aspects of the safety issues, & it all seems to be in order.

Agreed – to write to Mr Jim Barber, National Trust for written confirmation

753 OWNERSHIP OF LANE

The lane situated behind the Church (Ref – SK 155 150) is in an appalling condition.

Agreed to contact Highways to firstly establish ownership before further action can be taken.

Cllr A. Wager to re-contact concerning "clean up" of "Stoney Lane".

754 PARISH SURVEY

* Cllr M. Ellis re-capped on the recent Parish Council survey which has been carried out. A copy of the questions & subsequent actions taken are attached to the minutes.

* As a result of the survey 5 parishioners have formed a committee to arrange a village celebration to commemorate the "Queen's Jubilee". This will be held on Sunday June 3rd.

* Cllr W. Smith asked if the pump (non working) could be re-installed outside the pump house. Agreed – to obtain quote from Matthew Round.

A new lock has been put on the pump house. The keys (if required) are available from Cllrs M. Ellis, W. Smith.

755 FUTURE OF DOVEDALE TOILETS

Cllr W. Smith attended the recent meeting. Unfortunately several main bodies were absent. However, it seems to be apparent that PDNPA are trying to persuade private companies to take on the maintenance/upkeep of the toilets, but didn't seem to have surveyed the important points that were brought into issue. The situation is still ongoing.

- (ii) Cllr M. Ellis has obtained further quotes for the new village signs. The cost is £220 + VAT per sign. Cllr S. Ede will supply the posts. He stated to cut down the cost; he is prepared to waiver the invoice for the new posts recently installed in Digmire Lane (£360). Agreed to contact D.D.D.C. for permission to replace the existing village signs. Copy to PDNPA.

OTHER MATTERS

- (i) There has been a case of “fly tipping” at the lay-by in Narlows Lane. PCSO Kate Cleveley advised to contact Police if any further incidents occur.
- (ii) A parishioner suggested – re the ownership of the lane situated behind the Church, to contact the residents at “Hawthorn Cottage”, to enquire if they are aware of ownership.
Agreed Cllr A Wager to contact.

PARISH COUNCIL SURVEY, DECEMBER 2011.

68no. Questionnaires were delivered by hand by Parish Councillors and 50no. were collected in the same way. A 73% response.

As a result of the survey 5 parishioners have formed themselves into a committee to organise a “Queens Jubilee” celebration in June 2012. the Parish Council thank them for their involvement and offer their assistance if needed.

PARISHIONERS MOST COMMON RESPONSES

1. 29no. – 50% - were either happy with the Parish Council or made no comment
2. 3no. – 6% - were unhappy with the Parish Council & its activities.
The Council appreciates these criticisms, and any parishioner can attend any Council meeting to voice their opinions.
3. 5no. – 10% - complained of speeding vehicles through the village.
These parishioners will be written to personally by the Parish Council, and they will be offered the opportunity to join “Community Speedwatch.”
4. 4no. – 8% - requested more parishioners participation at Parish Council meetings.
The format of the Council meetings has been changed to allow parishioners involvement at the beginning & end of the meetings.
5. 5no. – 10% - complained about the cleanliness of the village roads.
We have contacted the appropriate authority, & we are allocated 4 power sweeps a year. The Council will now monitor this.
6. 4no. – 8% - of parishioners request more activities & amenities for children.
Whilst the Council accepts this is a valid point, there is not sufficient funds to finance this.
