Julia Crosby has written these words as I was enjoying a peaceful holiday on the island of Islay off the west coast of Scotland! A cheque has been sent to the local branch of the Red Cross. Thank you to all who contributed.

A letter has been received from *Christian Aid* thanking us for sending a donation of £40 raised at the Coffee morning which coincided with Christian Aid week. They said: "the money raised will go to help some of the world's poorest communities to lift themselves out of poverty, ensuring people, like 13 year old Musah and his sister Fatimata aged 11 from Ghana, are given a better quality of life. Both children have missed years of education because their nearest proper school was several hours' walk away. Musah's community challenged their government to campaign for a school, giving the children of his community the chance of a better future and a better quality of life."
