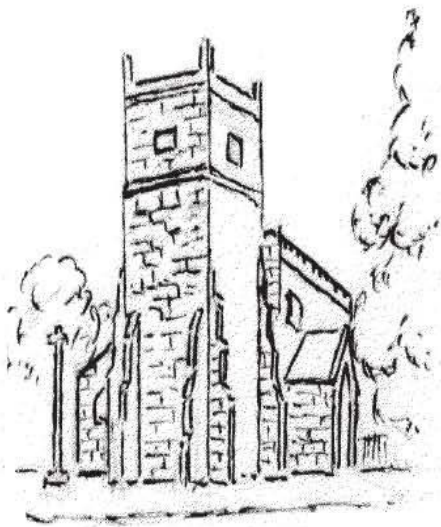
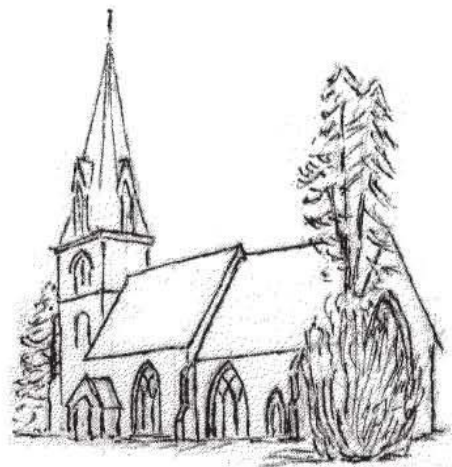

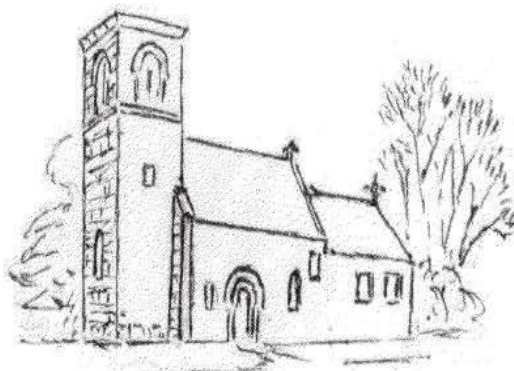

From your Vicar....

Dear friends

During some of our September services, I challenged you to bring forward new ideas for our church buildings. All our buildings are in good condition and are well loved and looked after. On the whole we do a good job of helping visitors learn about and enjoy the history. My challenge related to the fact that our buildings are of more than historic interest. They are places of worship, places where we come to encounter God. I asked us to think about how we could better help visitors to make use of the building in this way. I know that conversations are still going on but I thought I'd highlight some of the ideas folk raised with me.

Some suggested making candles available and playing gentle music. Others suggested having sheets available that explained the spiritual significance of different elements within the building and having prayers printed out on cards for people to pray whilst in the building.

Others suggested modifications to the lighting to highlight certain features. Someone pointed out that our big heavy doors are perhaps less than inviting and asked whether they could be left open with mesh doors installed to keep out the birds. Someone else suggested organising silent meditation sessions in the churches to encourage folk to become used to seeing the building as a spiritual place.

There are some great ideas here, do keep thinking about this and discussing it with each other.

Ros Hunt, who is church Warden at Thorpe and one of our lay readers (amongst other roles and responsibilities in the church, has been recognised for her services to the Church of England and awarded the Bishop's Badge by the Bishop of Derby. I'm sure you all join me in offering Ros our heartfelt congratulations and thanks for all she does.

A few days ago, our good friend David Hanson from Thorpe passed away. With his wife Faith, David did much to support our five churches over the years. His easy, gentle manner and obvious love for everyone he met gained him many friends. A man of deeply held personal faith in Jesus Christ, David was inspirational to so many of us. We hold Faith and the family in our prayers as they come to terms with their loss.

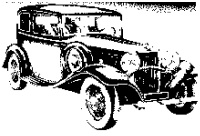

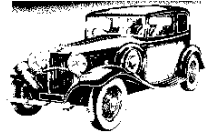

A Pudding for Autumn

Blackberry and Apple Betty good with clotted cream.

Ingredients

1kg Bramley apples – peeled and cored.
30g butter
200gm blackberries

For the crumb layer

125g soft white bread crumbs
75g soft light brown sugar
4 generous table spoons golden syrup

Method

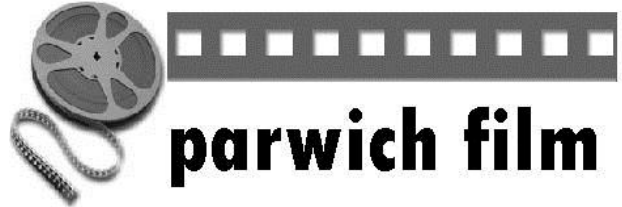
Pre heat oven 190c fan 170c gas 5.

Cut apples into large chunks, put into pan with the butter and 2 tablespoons of water and toss them over a moderate heat. When apples start to soften add blackberries then spoon into a 1.5 litre dish. Mix crumbs and sugar together and cover the fruit. Melt butter and syrup and pour over crumbs making sure to soak them all. Bake in oven for 35 to 40 min until golden.

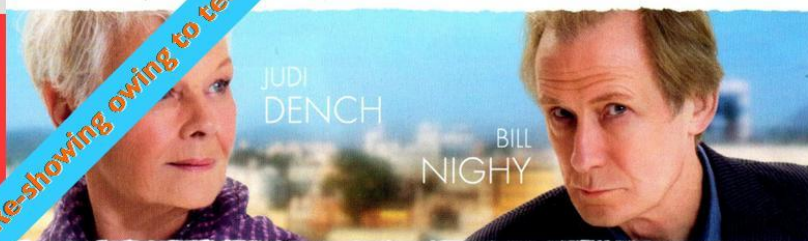

I would like to thank everyone for making this sponsored event on September 8th possible. All the Churchwardens for making sure that the churches were not only open but had the Register for cyclists/walkers to sign on easily available; all those who gave up their time to be at the church in Thorpe to welcome any cyclists or walkers.

It was certainly a most beautiful day for walking or cycling. Not only was the sun shining but almost everyone whom I passed had a smile on their face – which felt most uplifting.

I started at Alsop church, walked to Parwich where a wedding was due to take place and then over the hill to Tissington calling in at the Chapel and the parish church, where another wedding was imminent. I continued to Fenny Bentley church and then again on to the Tissington Trail and down to Ashbourne, stopping at the cycle hire place for a bacon bap and cup of coffee! Then through the old railway tunnel to St. Oswald's church where another wedding was about to take place! I signed in at the Corner Stone cafe for the Methodist church before visiting the Roman Catholic church on Belle Vue Road where a wedding was actually in progress! St. John's church was the last one to be visited before making my way to the top of Buxton Hill and then down and over the Tissington Trail to climb up to Callow Top Camp Site, before descending down to Mappleton, where I was greeted by someone in the church and by some cyclists on the Ride & Stride from Hulland and Kniveton. The last part of the walk took me along the river Dove and up to Thorpe church.

A very special thank you to everyone who has sponsored me. You have all been incredibly generous. The final amount raised has reached over £500 which is truly amazing. The Trust certainly needs money in order to help churches or chapels by giving grants for their repair and maintenance. Half of the money raised will come back to St. Leonard's church plus Gift Aid. Thorpe Harvest Festival

I always enjoy Harvest Festival. As a child, the church always looked lovely, war or no war. Later, when I married and went to East Africa, harvest was a rather different affair. There had been a drought for the previous three years before we had arrived and the local people had suffered greatly. There were no babies or children

under five. No old people either, all had crept out into the bush to die so as to leave young people, who were fit enough to work in the fields, when the rains finally came. And of course, no T.V. coverage or appeals for help. So a Festival of Thanksgiving for a good harvest was a time of celebration and joy, of dancing and feasting and drinking the local beer, or pombe as it was called.

Later when we went back to England and went to our local Methodist Church, harvest was as I remembered it. The church was filled with food from gardens and allotments and also from local shops. We took apples and also the biggest marrow we could manage to grow. I often wondered if it was fit to eat, but was told that it went to a local home and was well received. Food and flowers were then packed into boxes and given to those in need, for a list had been drawn up in advance and the contents chosen accordingly.

When we came to live in Thorpe, it felt very special to be able to celebrate harvest in a small but beautiful Norman church with farming neighbours sitting beside us and surrounded by a green and beautiful countryside. So the service began with that lovely old hymn, "Come ye thankful people, come," followed later by "We plough the fields and scatter", and then, "For the beauty of the earth". And so, we continued to sit and sing and pray and share our pleasure and joy in God's creation and also to remember others less fortunate than we are.

Harvest traditions are different too. Instead of a shared lunch afterwards in a church hall, the harvest gifts are taken to the village hall for an auction and a pie and pea supper the following evening. The supper is always good fun and a chance to meet up with neighbours and exchange news. Eventually the noise abates and the auction begins. This year the auctioneers were Peter Sadler and Chris Wainwright. Each brought their own brand of fun to the proceedings. Adults and children alike bid for the auction lots. Children bid for lots on behalf of their parents or for bags of sweets, while adults vie with each other for pickles, jams and flowers. This year there was a shortage of bags of apples, pears, plums and damsons as village gardens suffered from prolonged rain and

unseasonable chill. Farmers too have had much to contend with. I understand that Lincolnshire farmers are unable to harvest their potatoes and they are rotting in the fields, while local farmers have struggled with grass cutting and silage making.

This year's auction was in aid of *The Padley Centre* in Derby, and also to "Send a Cow" to help poor farmers in the third world. The total sum of £791.00 was raised for these good causes from the auction as well as donations. Finally, I want to thank all those hard working folk who gave of their time and energy to make these events such wonderful occasions and who have given all who come such pleasure and joy in shared village events.
