We are so lucky to live in such a beautiful part of the Peak District and this term we have certainly made best use of the village thanks to the Peak Park.



Free School Meals



Children of families receiving certain benefits could be entitled to free school meals and other education benefits. 16-18 year olds receiving these benefits in their own right are also entitled to free school meals.

If your family lives in Derbyshire and has a low income, you may be able to get help with the cost of full-time education for your child.

You may be able to get:

- Free school meals
- Help with travel costs
- Help with music fees
- Help with cycle training

In order to get financial help you need to be receiving One of the following benefits:

- Income support
- Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit, with a taxable income of no more than £16,190 and not in receipt of Working Tax Credit
- Pension Credit (Guarantee Credit)
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit payable at a rate higher than the family element i.e. £545.34 (this is £1,095.00 if you also have a child under one year old).
- Working Tax Credit, Housing Benefit or Council Tax Benefit (not including second adult rebate)
- Working tax credit during the four week period immediately after
 employment finished or after you start to work less than 16 hours per week

To make the application process as easy as possible the application form for free school meals is now on the Derbyshire website - www.derbyshire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals.

Parents can still apply by asking for a form from their school, or by phoning the free school meals team on 01629 536481.
