- 3. All vegetables and flowers shown must be grown in the exhibitor 's own ground. This rule does not apply to the Artistic arrangement classes.
- 4. The Committee will take every care with each article exhibited, but will not accept any responsibility whatsoever for loss or damage
- 5. All exhibits, except the Pot Plant and Artistic classes will be auctioned after the show. Only successful bidders may remove auctionable items from the Show.
- 6. All prize money will be paid out on the day of the Show.
- 7. Judges are appointed by the Committee and a judge's decision is final.
- 8. Only persons authorized to do so by the Secretary will be allowed to enter the Showroom while judging is taking place.
- The Committee has the authority to deal with any matter not provided for in these rules.
- 10. Every effort will be made to accommodate all entries but space for staging cannot be guaranteed. Later entries will not be accepted if space is not available, or if judging has already commenced.
