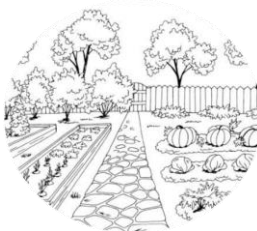


## Tallis Trophy for best entry in classes 6 and 7

9 8 – 11 years

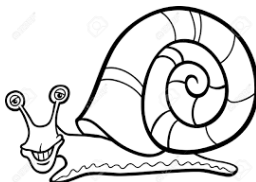


## Parwich Horticultural Cup for best entry in classes 10 & 11
